Beth Israel Congregation of Lexington Park, MD Constitution Passed by the Congregation, 1978 Amended, 1983, 1988, 1997, 1998, 2002, 2005, 2012, 2022 and 2024 **Preamble** The objective of the Beth Israel Congregation is to be the community center of Conservative Jewish worship, Jewish study, thought, education, fellowship, charity, and community relationships. It shall be the responsibility of the members and officers who compose the Congregation to provide for these needs of the Jewish community at large. This constitution provides the governing rules and regulations to accomplish these objectives, and shall be amended when needed to best achieve the spirit of these objectives. Article I, Membership Section 1. Membership shall be open to any person of the Jewish faith. Section 2. There shall be two types of full membership. A. Household Membership. All membership privileges shall be extended to married couples and couples in the same household. At least one member of the couple must be of the Jewish faith. Each couple shall be entitled to two votes in Congregation meetings. If one member is not present at a Congregation meeting, the attending member may cast two votes. B. **Individual Membership**. Such membership shall be extended to individuals and shall entitle the member to one vote in Congregation meetings. Section 3. Associate Membership. For members who do not reside in Southern Maryland (approx. 75 miles from the synagogue). Associate members may not vote in Congregation meetings nor hold office in the Congregation. Section 4. Complimentary Membership. Complimentary memberships shall be extended to the following: A. Jewish full-time college students. B. Jewish citizens of foreign countries resident for less than one year. C. Jews currently serving in the U.S. armed forces in a pay grade of E5 or lower. D. New Jewish residents during the first three months of their residence in the community.

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Section 2. Only members in good standing shall be eligible to serve as Officers of the Congregation. The members who serve as President and Vice President must be Jewish. Section 3. Officer Duties. The officers of the Congregation shall perform the duties prescribed by this constitution. A. The President shall lead the Congregation, preside over Executive Committee and the Board of Directors (further referred to as the "Board"), appoint chairs to all standing committees, and shall represent the Congregation to the community-at-large. B. The Vice President shall assume the duties in the absence of the President. The Vice President shall coordinate the activities of all committees and is an ex-officio member of all standing committees, except the Executive Committee where the Vice President is a member. C. The Recording Secretary shall call the roll and record the minutes of Congregation, Board, and Executive Committee meetings. The Recording Secretary is a member of the Executive Committee. D. The Corresponding Secretary shall communicate all minutes and official notices to the members of the Congregation and, when necessary, to the Jewish community at large, and shall be responsible for the official correspondence of the Congregation. E. The Treasurer shall collect all Congregation dues, fees, assessments, and donations, and pay all Congregation expenses from these monies as authorized by the Congregation, Board, or the Executive Committee. Section 4. The Nominating Committee, comprised of the Past President as chairperson and one other member appointed by the Executive Committee, shall select a slate of candidates for their respective offices. The Congregation shall be notified of the slate in writing or by electronic means at least ten days before the election meeting. (passed 9/30/2005) (passed 6/10/2012) Section 5. A Congregation meeting shall be held before the June Board meeting to elect officers. A slate of candidates for its officers shall be put before the Congregation by the Board. Before the election of each officer, additional nominations from the floor shall be permitted. Section 6. Officers shall be elected for a two-year term that shall begin at the June Board Meeting. A. Officers may serve multiple terms at the discretion of the Congregation or the Board. B. In the event of an officer vacancy prior to completion of the term, the Executive Committee shall appoint a replacement to complete that term.

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157	A. Executive Committee. This is a leadership committee made up of the
158	following officers; President serving as its chairman, Vice President, Treasurer, and Recording
159	Secretary. This committee meets as directed by the President to address confidential issues and
160	support timely action where convening the entire board is not practical or necessary.
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162	B. Parliamentarian. The Parliamentarian shall advise the President and the
163	Board on "Robert's Rules of Order" and act as the Historian for the Congregation.
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165	C. Religious Services Committee. This committee shall be in charge of all
166	religious services of the Congregation, subject to the approval of the Board, and will ensure that
167	religious services are held on Jewish holidays and on occasions of special observance, and will
168	advise the Board and Executive Committee on matters of religious ritual.
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170	D. Talmud Torah Committee. This committee shall supervise the Religious
171	School of the Congregation and shall determine policy and formulate rules for the Religious
172	School subject to the approval of the Board.
173	
174	(1) The Talmud Torah Committee will ensure that the Religious School
175	provides for the teaching of Jewish history, philosophy, culture, and thought to the school-aged
176	Jewish children of the community.
177	
178	(2) The Chair of the committee shall recruit, vet, recommend to the Board,
179	and supervise Hebrew School Teachers.
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181	(3) In addition, the school shall provide for the teaching of the Hebrew
182	language and the requirements of Bar or Bat Mitzvah, excluding specific Haftorah study.
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- E. **Ways and Means Committee**. This committee shall plan and execute special fund-raising events and projects for the Congregation, subject to the approval of the Board.
- F. **Membership Committee**. This committee shall identify and recruit new members from the community and advise the Board of membership applications and new Jewish members in the community.
- G. **House Committee**. This committee shall be responsible for maintaining the synagogue and for supervising the use of the synagogue or other Congregational property, subject to the approval of the Board.
- H. **Building, Planning and Funding Committee**. This committee shall be responsible for the long-range planning of building improvements and expansions for the synagogue, and for the acquisition of funds for the purpose of implementing those plans, subject to the approval of the Board.
- I. **Publicity Committee**. This committee shall be responsible for publicizing all functions and activities of the synagogue to the community through the use of media, subject to the approval of the Board. (passed 6/19/83)
- J. **Newsletter Committee**. This committee shall be responsible for publicizing all functions and activities of the Congregation to its members and those who might consider joining the Congregation by publishing a newsletter. The content of the newsletter is subject to the approval of the Board. (passed 8/25/02)
- K. **Security Committee.** This committee shall evaluate and recommend physical security needs and protocols to the Board to ensure the safety and security of the synagogue building and those using it. The Committee shall ensure, assess, and periodically evaluate existing procedures and processes for access control, emergency response planning, and security training of the congregation. The committee shall coordinate with the Technology Committee and with county law enforcement as appropriate. (passed 6/16/2022)
- L. **Technology Committee.** This committee shall evaluate, maintain, and keep current existing technology used by the synagogue for security and other purposes, ensure full compliance with manufacturers' warranties and operational guidance, and coordinate with technology vendors, as required. As directed by the Board, the committee shall recommend and procure technology acquisitions and/or upgrades for the synagogue. (passed 6/16/2022)

Article IV, Board of Directors

Section 1. The Board of Directors of the Congregation shall be composed of the elected officers of the Congregation, the Chairs of the standing committees, a representative of the Sisterhood of the Congregation, the Immediate Past President of the Congregation, and the Congregation Rabbi, *ex officio*, as a non-voting member. Chairs of standing committees may serve multiple one-year terms at the discretion of the Congregation or the Board respectively.

Section 2. The Board shall have regular monthly meetings. The dates and times of the meetings shall be set by the President. A quorum for a Board meeting shall consist of a simple majority of its members. All members of the Board shall have one vote. A majority of the Board may also call Board meetings. Section 3. The proceedings of the Board meetings are, to the greatest extent possible, conducted under the "Robert's Rules of Order". Section 4. **Duties of the Board** A. The Board shall plan and coordinate the overall program of the Congregation. No Congregation function may be scheduled or held without the approval of the Board. Religious functions will take precedence over all other functions. B. The Board or its representative shall interview all potential employees of the Congregation. Employees may be hired by the President upon the candidate's approval by the Board. C. The Board shall be the authority for the interpretation of the Constitution. **Article V, Congregation Meetings** Section 1. Congregation shall, at a minimum, meet to elect officers, review the budget, and approve constitutional amendments. Section 2. All meetings of the Congregation may be held in-person, virtually, or in combination. Meetings of the Congregation may be held as necessary.

Section 3. A quorum is needed to hold a Congregation meeting. For all matters other than Constitution amendments, a quorum consists of one-fourth of the membership, excluding honorary members, associate members, and complimentary members, and including at least one officer. Quorum threshold for Constitution amendments is found in Article IX Section 2B. Members of a quorum include those attending in-person and virtually and through the use of a quorum proxy—a proxy for the sole purpose of obtaining a quorum and nothing else. A sample quorum proxy is found in Appendix A of this Constitution

Section 4. Additional meetings of the Congregation may be called under any one of the following circumstances:

A. When the President deems it necessary.

B. By a majority vote of the Executive Committee.

C. Within two weeks after receiving a petition signed by at least one-fourth of the membership, excluding honorary and complimentary members.
